For this project, AFOP conducted a special survey with farmworker children from 3 different regions (West, East and Mid-Central)

In order to protect the farmworker children surveyed, AFOP changed the children's names, and did not mentioned the states where they live.





- 75% are age under 15 years old.
- 49% female

• 51% male

- 92% of the children work their parents
- •77% identified Spanish as their dominant language



EDUCATION & MIGRATION

- 57% of surveyed farmworker children expressed that migrating affects their grades
- 30% expressed that is hard to keep up in class while migrating
- 46% migrate from state to state to work in the fields



FAMILY & **MIGRATION**

- 65% live with their mom and dad
- 5 average number of family members living in the same household
- •Only 32% have some kind of legal status.
- 46% migrate during the school year



FARMWORK

- About 95% of the kids surveyed starting working in the fields between ages 5 and 6
- 59% work on **Summer Break** • 35% work All Year
- 78% expressed that they liked going to school more than going to work in the fields
